Layout the bark and hold it in place with rocks or cement blocks. It's unlikely that you were able to find a tree with sufficient girth to give you a a roll of bark long enough and wide enough to construct the canoe in one piece. The birchbark canoe was the principal means of water transportation for Aboriginal peoples of the Eastern Woodlands, and later voyageurs, who used it extensively in the fur trade in Canada. Light and maneuverable, birchbark canoes were perfectly adapted to summer travel through the network of shallow streams, ponds, lakes and swift rivers of the Canadian Shield .

The smaller ones were around 13 feet in length while the largest Montreal canoes reached 36 feet in length and were capable of carrying, in addition to paddlers, around 4 tons of cargo. My canoe is a 16-foot Chippewa style, meaning the bow and stern are "C" shaped.

These are made with leftover materials during the off season. While not indestructible plastic, these canoes are more durable than most people realize. When wet, the spruce root stitching becomes pliable and the 1 / 8 to 3 / 16 inch thick birchbark becomes leather-like. Gunwale stitching.

Birch bark canoes are best built on a soft spot on the ground and in the shade so that the bark doesn't dry out and become brittle. If you don't have access to a leafy forest site it's a good idea to build a temporary shelter because the bark can't be worked well if it dries out.
